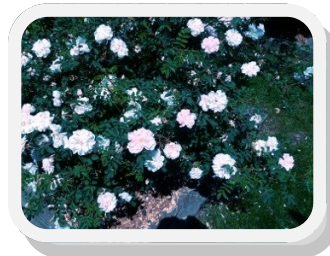

125th Marshfield Fire Anniversary—Flag Raising Ceremony

The well planned event began on the warm summer day of June 28th with an oak tree planting which symbolized Mayor William Upham's raising and rebuilding his business thereby spurring the town of a three thousand citizens to rise from the ashes of an enormous fire.

Mayor William Upham, portrayed by NWCHS Past President Tom Ptak, wearing a tailored vested black suit, brimmed gray hat and a mustache, disembarked from the head automobile of the parade and walked to the podium on the Upham Mansion front porch. Monie and Darby Upham- granddaughters of William Upham, Marshfield Mayor Chris Meyer, and Dave Anderson - District Director of the 7th District of Wisconsin also attended. Mayor Meyer introduced Mayor Upham who spoke to the visitors as he did in 1887 at 6:00am on the day following the great fire. The speech brought the visitors back in time encouraging them with much conviction that he would rebuild his business. Mayor Upham spoke of the facts and figures of the fire and then made closing remarks of his intent to in the next few weeks rebuild the mill and then most of his businesses by the end of the year. He brought reverence to the end of his speech, by ordering the US flag raised, symbolizing his intent and raising the citizen's hopes for employment, and stone cement business construction for fire prevention.

Towards the end of the event Joe Finamore sang a song he had composed commemorating the 125th Marshfield Fire Anniversary. To write the song Joe had studied many of historic documents written by the fire victims.





WHS Grant Awarded!

In June, with the help of Doug Seubert, NWCHS submitted an application for a Mini-grant offered by the Wisconsin Historical Society & Wisconsin Council for Local History. In August we were notified that we were awarded the grant! The matching grant was for \$700 to be used towards archival material. NWCHS will match the grant with \$700 raised through the Pie and Ice Cream Social and a generous donation given by Monie Upham.

Most of the money raised by the Society usually goes towards operational expenses and Mansion upkeep. This grant will ensure the proper storage of original documents entrusted to NWCHS so that they can be preserved and protected for future generations, as well as enable patrons, students and researchers to locate and utilize them safely.

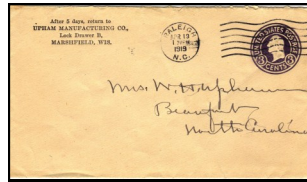
Florence Mickelson

Upham Letters



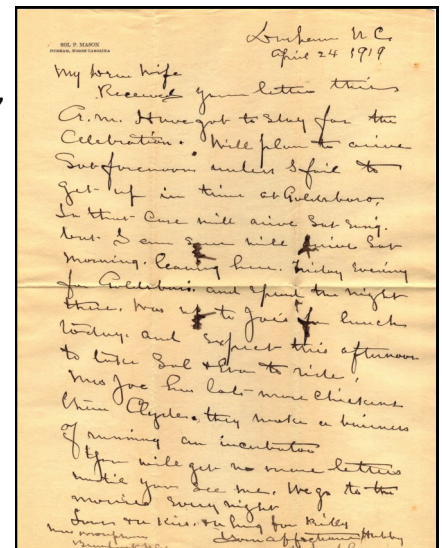
Monie Upham loaned to NWCHS a box of letters that William Upham wrote to Grace during their short courtship. The loan was for one month so that we could scan the letters and place them into archival sleeves and binders for preservation. Ranging in dates from 1915 to 1922 the majority of letters were written in March, April and May of 1915.

William Upham's intention, prior to meeting Grace in Beaufort, NC, was to sail his yacht 'the Comrade' from De Pere, WI to Chicago down the Illinois and Mississippi Rivers, through the Gulf of Mexico, up the East Coast and through the Great Lakes via the Hudson River, completing his voyage back in Chicago. He started on November 7, 1913—which incidentally happened to be on the first day of the great 'White Hurricane', which raged the Great Lakes from 7-11 November! He got as far as Sturgeon Bay, WI and waited out the storm for 4 days.

After meeting Grace, William continued his voyage, writing as he went, describing where he was and what he was doing all the while courting from a distance.

On April 17, 1915 William cut his voyage short and left from Philadelphia for Chicago via train. He spent a couple days in Chicago and Milwaukee before returning to Marshfield April 27th. The letters continue up through May 27th prior to arriving back in Beaufort for their June 1st wedding. After they were married the remaining letters were written when William took trips away from Marshfield and in May 1922 when Grace was at St. Mary's Hospital in Rochester, Minnesota.
